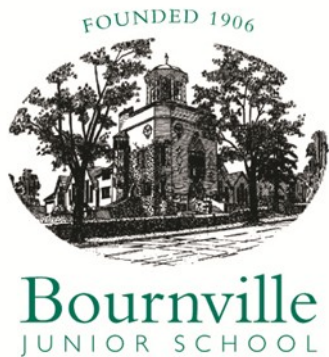


Year 3 Learning Preview- Summer 1

ENGLISH

This half-term, we will be covering the following units based on the book, 'The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane' by Kate DiCamillo.

- Writing a summary of predictions
- A diary entry in role as Edward
- A letter, in role, as Edward
- A biography about Sarah Ruth
- A narrative—the next chapter
- A comparative report between two texts

SPELLING, PUNCTUATION AND GRAMMAR

This term we will be focussing on:

- Extending a range of sentences using a variety of conjunctions
- Choosing appropriate nouns and pronouns
- Conjunctions, adverbs and prepositions to express time, place and cause
- Use of fronted adverbials
- Use of paragraphs
- Correct use of commas
- Use of inverted commas for direct speech

We request that you encourage your child to practise their list 2, 3 or 4 spellings at home.

MATHEMATICS

In number we will investigate:

- **Fractions:** recognising and showing, using diagrams, equivalent fractions, adding and subtracting fractions with the same denominator, comparing and ordering fractions and using the skills learned to solve problems.


In geometry we will investigate:

- **Geometry:** To recognise angles as a property of shape or a description of a turn, identifying right angles, recognising that two right angles make a half-term, three make three quarters of a turn and four make a complete turn and to identify whether angles are greater than or less than a right angle.

<p>LEARNING ADVENTURE— ‘The Ancient Greeks’ This term we will be beginning our exciting topic: the Greeks. To start, pupils will be learning about life in Ancient Greece. We will be using maps to look at how the country has changed and what the Greeks did for us today. We will also be investigating democracy and how it works. We will also be studying the Spartans and trying to understand why they were so tough.
